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Paris – Artcurial Motorcars has created a new summer rendez-vous for collectors' car enthusiasts that will alternate with the department's biennial sale at Le Mans Classic. The first in the series will take place on Sunday 2 July 2017, at the Grimaldi Forum in the heart of the Principality.

The return to Monaco follows three significant sales, including the sale of Reserves from the Prince's Museum Collection in 2012 and, more recently, cars belonging to Maria Callas in 2015. The auction house will pay tribute to what makes the Principality such a special place, from the silver screen to motor racing, with competition cars that have graced the track alongside glamorous convertibles that are at home on the streets of the Riviera.

Around a hundred automobiles will come under the hammer. One of many Porsches consigned is a stunning 1974 3.0L RSR (estimate: 1,4 – 1,8 M€ / 1,5 – 1,9 M\$) that has taken part in the biggest races in America until 1986, including the Daytona 24 Hours and both the Sebring and Laguna Seca 12 Hours. Other competition cars lining up include a Renault 5 Turbo *Tour de Corse*. The glamorous image of the French Riviera will be enhanced by a selection of convertible cars, ranging from the iconic 1962 Ferrari 250 GT Cabriolet series II, in concours condition, (estimate 1,4 – 1,8 M€ / 1,5 – 1,9 M\$) to the fun Fiat 500 'Jolly' (est. 14 000 – 18 000 € / 15 400 – 19 800 \$ no reserve).

This new biennial event reinforces the strengths of Artcurial's motor car department (market leader in continental Europe) and the auction house's presence on The Rock. Artcurial has been holding twice-yearly sales in Monaco (January and July) for more than ten years, dedicated to Collectors' Watches, Fine Jewellery and Vintage Hermès. The next of these sales will take place on 17 – 19 July.
